

University of Phoenix is offering an opportunity to teachers who have completed the California Teacher of English Learners (CTEL) requirement or the Beginning Teacher Support and Assessment (BTSA) program. Educators who provide verification of completion of the BTSA can waive thirteen credits of an MAEd in Curriculum and Instruction or six credits with a CTEL. The College of Education is one of the few institutions to offer this waiver.

The MAEd in Curriculum and Instruction program is designed to help educators become instructional leaders who impact student learning and influence teacher quality by engaging with fellow teachers. The program focuses on best practices in assessment, coaching and mentoring, curriculum development and instructional practices.
